

The conference was held last September in the intellectually and architecturally stimulating environment of Cambridge, at Hall College. The programme included a wide variety of speakers on subjects ranging from the progressive work of Fosters' to Latham, High Performance Buildings and Motivating Your Team together with a panel discussion on The Role and Influence of the Designer Post-Reorganisation. The title of 'The Challenge of Change' was addressed by two keynote speeches given by Brian Briscoe, Chief Executive of the Local Government Association, and Sir Michael Latham, formerly Chairman of the Construction Industry Board.

Local Government Association replaces the separate associations for metropolitan authorities, county district councils. The aim of the organisation is to provide a strong united voice for local government at a time when it is having to meet the major challenges of reorganisation, compulsory competitive tendering and budget cuts with only 15% of income derived from local sources. It is a delicate balancing act for the new association, with a number of pressure groups legitimately pursuing matters of concern to them, but it has a brief to present a common voice for local government particularly in the following areas- local public services, community leadership, local strategies, partnership/ contracts and democratic renewal. By speaking for all councils in England and Wales it will have a powerful voice which will be able to protect local democracy, maintain local services and help ensure that local discretion and choice is retained in the face of greater centralisation. The long term strategy is to enhance local democracy by improving relations with the government and Europe which will both preserve and enhance the roles of local authorities.

It is difficult to open any construction publication without reading of progress on 'Constructing the Team', the report published in July,1994, by the committee chaired by Sir Michael Latham. The

report was a joint government/industry initiative with two aims- to reduce conflict and litigation and also to improve the productivity and competitiveness of the industry. The main recommendations were:

- to publish a construction procurement strategy Code of Practice
- to publish a checklist guide on briefing
- to promote a mechanism for selecting consultants on quality as well as price

To facilitate this a Construction Clients Forum was set up in August,1994, and the government undertook to become a best practice client with documents published in 1995 which are listed at the end of this report. The Forum comprised 13 organisations none of which directly represented construction professionals who were involved at working group level. The recommendations are in the three main areas of industry, contracts and legislation with the latter forming part 2 of the Housing, Grants, Construction and Regeneration Act which introduces these mandatory provisions:

- to refer disputes to adjudication (currently in conflict with the 1996 Arbitration Act)
- to provide a statutory right to interim payments
- to incorporate a clear cut payments mechanism
- to restrict a clients right to withhold payment
- to give a contractor the right to suspend work if payment is not forthcoming
- to ensure payment to a contractor is not conditional on receipt of payment from a third party

The legislation only applies to written contracts and excludes contracts with private householders, PFI, supply only contracts and the process engineering industry. It includes architectural design or surveying work and associated professional advice together with painting / decorating and mechanical / electrical work. The Secretary of State accepts that the Act cannot cover the many and varied situations that arise


under a construction contract and will be publishing a Scheme for Construction Contracts which will be compulsory in situations of noncompliance and also sweep up matters not specifically covered by the legislation. The Construction Industry Board have published the following eight reports with a further five to be published over the next few months:

- Selecting consultants for the team: balancing quality and price
- Training the team
- Constructing a better image
- Tomorrow's team: women and men in

construction

- Educating the professional team
- Towards a 30% productivity improvement in construction
- Framework for a national register of consultants
- Framework for a national register of contractors

Many thanks to Alan Tyler and his team for organising an excellent conference. We look forward to this years conference which will be on the function of property post local government reorganisation.

## PROFESSIONAL AFFAIRS COMMITTEE

The joint CIPFA/SCALA Client Advisory Service for Construction and Property Services CCT now has over 140 members which should mean an increase in income for SCALA.

The committee will pass on PFI and CCT info. to members as it becomes available and has responded to the DoE on the latest proposed changes to the CCT Regs.
