## Delivering Educational SPACES

Friday 23rd June 2017 Manchester School of Architecture

After last years extremely successful sell out event, the study day is continuing with the popular theme of Education where will be examining how best to successfully deliver and maintain school buildings with challenging programmes and budgets but without compromising quality, maintenance and the environment.

The study day is designed to have a wide appeal by stimulating debate, sharing experiences and lessons learned and give the opportunity to make new networks. It is very much a 'nuts-and-bolts, hands-on' event with the emphasis on real experiences and lessons learned.
