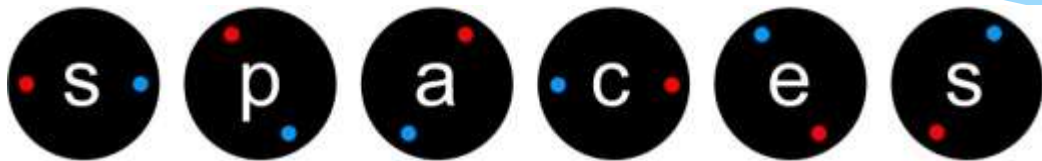

Ladies and Gents toilets are located throughout the building and there are accessible toilets on each floor.



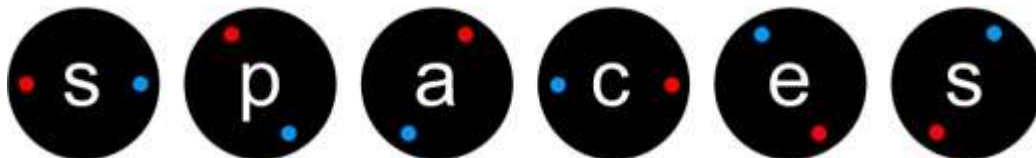

Please be considerate and turn your mobile to silent, or turn it off.

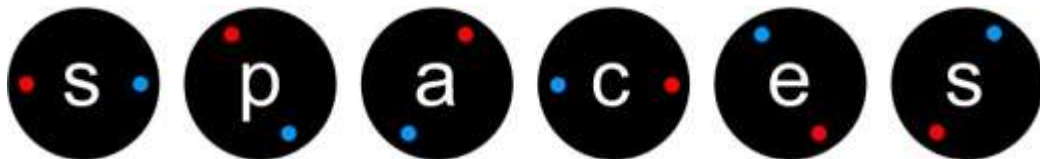


The building is fully accessible. Infrared hearing loop is available in all lecture theatres.

 - CBSS (Building Surveyors est. 1972)

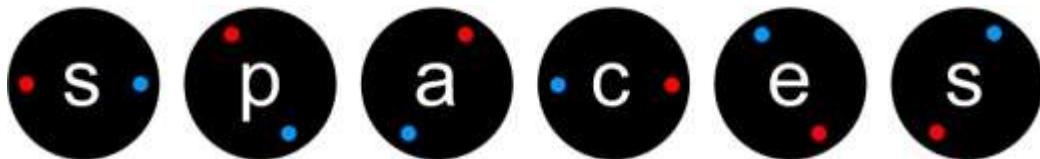

Our Common Objectives

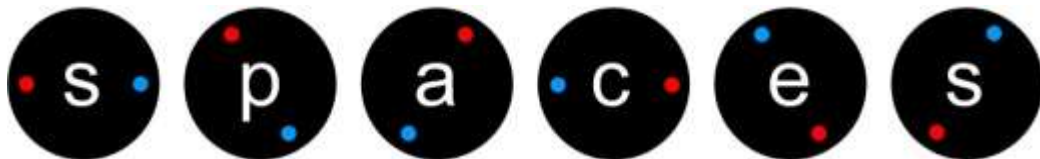
- Promote good design and maintenance.
